





A product design project focused on re-designing the potter's wheel to be as functional, beautiful, and versatile as possible. The project showcases product development skills, including user research, sketching, and CAD prototyping, as well as branding design (logo and packaging design). Through extensive research and user feedback, I identified key areas for improvement, such as ergonomics and adaptability, and incorporated these insights into the design. The final product balances form and function, offering a modern, aesthetically appealing tool for potters while enhancing usability.

Potter Interviews

I conducted interviews with experienced potters to gain valuable insights into their needs, challenges, and preferences when using a pottery wheel. These interviews allowed me to gather firsthand feedback on ergonomics, functionality, and areas for improvement, which directly influenced the design's user-centered approach.

In 'Vulva Kitchen', I delve into the intricacies of modern domesticity, employing ceramic artistry to examine the nuanced roles of women and gender nonconforming individuals. Through live cast vulvas sourced from diverse ages, cultures, and backgrounds, I explore the complexities of inequality and societal expectations. Using alginate, a skin-safe material, I meticulously capture these forms, translating them into plaster molds to unveil the hidden narratives of our bodies and lives. The kitchen, a symbolic site of domesticity, becomes both a canvas and a commentary on patriarchal structures. By reclaiming this space for artistic expression, I aim to empower others to challenge conventional narratives and assert their presence in the domestic sphere. 'Vulva Kitchen' is not just an exhibition; it's a call to action, urging viewers to reconsider the significance of the spaces we inhabit and the stories they tell.



Medium Glazed Tile & Enamel For Spendaporium's October show themed "Tarot," I exhibited six hand-painted tiles as part of my ongoing tarot deck project. My deep connection to tarot in my artistic practice inspired me to create my own deck, channeling divine feminine rage into each piece. This project is a response to the often-overlooked contributions of Pamela Colman Smith, the artist behind the widely known yet misnamed "Rider-Waite" deck. Smith's visionary work is rarely credited, though her illustrations have shaped the visual language of tarot for over a century. My representation of queer and trans bodies within the deck is part of an ongoing exploration of narrative, creating space for marginalized identities in this powerful, symbolic tradition. Through my deck, I seek to honor Smith's legacy while expressing my own evolving story.
